A Reading from the Epistles

2 Timothy 2:8-15

Listen for the Word of God in Paul's second letter to Timothy, verses 8 through 15 of chapter 2.

Remember Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, a descendant of David--that is my gospel, for which I suffer hardship, even to the point of being chained like a criminal. But the word of God is not chained. Therefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, so that they may also obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus, with eternal glory. The saying is sure: If we have died with him, we will also live with him; if we endure, we will also reign with him; if we deny him, he will also deny us; if we are faithless, he remains faithful-- for he cannot deny himself. Remind them of this, and warn them before God that they are to avoid wrangling over words, which does no good but only ruins those who are listening. Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved by him, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly explaining the word of truth.

This is where the Epistle Lesson for the 18th Sunday after Pentecost ends. [will those who are able please stand for the reading of the Gospel]

*A Reading from the Gospels

Luke 17:11-19

Hear the good news of Jesus Christ as recorded by Luke in the 17th chapter beginning at the 11th verse and following.

Praise be to you, O Christ.

On the way to Jerusalem Jesus was going through the region between Samaria and Galilee. As he entered a village, ten lepers approached him. Keeping their distance, they called out, saying, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!" When he saw them, he said to them, "Go and show yourselves to the priests." And as they went, they were made clean. Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice. He prostrated himself at Jesus' feet and thanked him. And he was a Samaritan. Then Jesus asked, "Were not ten made clean? But the other nine, where are they? Was none of them found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?" Then he said to him, "Get up and go on your way; your faith has made you well."

This is where the reading ends. It is the gospel of the Lord.

SEARCH COMMITTEE will meet tomorrow, Monday, October 14th, at 6:00 pm in the Church Library.

LEFTOVERS!: Do we have leftovers from last week. Because one can never be sure about what the number of servings for a recipe means, the bakers were asked to make two batches; there is leftover bread. Because the one purchasing the dry ingredients cannot add and multiply correctly, there are leftover dry ingredients. All are for purchase in the gathering area. The breads were frozen to assist with freshness and have been thawed for instant enjoyment. Donations are requested to offset the costs to the church.

ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING will take place on Sunday, November 10th. There will be only one service that morning at 9 am. The meeting to follow the service.

Annual Meeting Choir: Since there is only one service on November 10th, there is an opportunity for folks who normally attend the early service to sing in the choir. CONSTITUTION & BY-LAWS: At the Annual Meeting on November 10, 2019, we will vote on some amendments to our Constitution and By-Laws. Major changes include removing the list and descriptions of committees and task groups including term limits that we find impossible to follow. Committees will now be controlled by Council so adjustments can be made as needed (See Section 4.1 of the By-laws). We adjusted the terms for Elders to coordinate with having 4 Elders rather than 6, a change we made three years ago (See Section 4.2) We also added the word *active* <u>before</u> *member* in several locations to emphasize that quorums will be determined based on <u>active</u> membership. We replaced general mailing with communication to reflect our current use of electronic as well as paper communications (See Constitution Section 7.2, By-laws Section 5.3 and 5.4). Copies of the current [white paper] and proposed [pink] By-Laws are available on the information table.
