A Word for Children

Lessons for Today

A Reading from the Old Testament

Genesis 32:22-31

Let us pay attention to God's Word for us as it is found in the book of Genesis beginning with the 22nd verse of chapter 32.

The same night he got up and took his two wives, his two maids, and his eleven children, and crossed the ford of the Jabbok. He took them and sent them across the stream, and likewise everything that he had. Jacob was left alone; and a man wrestled with him until daybreak. When the man saw that he did not prevail against Jacob, he struck him on the hip socket; and Jacob's hip was put out of joint as he wrestled with him. Then he said, "Let me go, for the day is breaking." But Jacob said, "I will not let you go, unless you bless me. So he said to him, "What is your name?" And he said, "Jacob. Then the man said, "You shall no longer be called Jacob, but Israel, for you have striven with God and with humans, and have prevailed. Then Jacob asked him, "Please tell me your name." But he said, "Why is it that you ask my name?" And there he blessed him. So Jacob called the place Peniel, saying, "For I have seen God face to face, and yet

my life is preserved. The sun rose upon him as he passed Peniel, limping because of his hip.

The reading of the Lesson from the Old Testament ends here. Let us be blessed.

A Reading from the Epistles

2 Timothy 3:14-4:5

Listen for the Word of God in Paul's second letter to Timothy. It begins with the 14th verse of chapter 3 and ends at chapter 4, verse 5.

But as for you, continue in what you have learned and firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it, and how from childhood you have known the sacred writings that are able to instruct you for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, so that everyone who belongs to God may be proficient, equipped for every good work.

In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and in view of his appearing and his kingdom, I solemnly urge you: proclaim the message; be persistent whether the time is favorable or unfavorable; convince, rebuke, and encourage, with the utmost patience in teaching. For the time is coming when people will not put up with sound doctrine, but having itching ears, they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own desires, and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander away to myths. As for you, always be sober, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, carry out your ministry fully.

This is where the Epistle Lesson for the 19th Sunday after Pentecost ends. May we be blessed.

*A Reading from the Gospels

Luke 18:1-8

Hear the good news of Jesus Christ as remembered by Luke in the first 8 verses of chapter 18.

Praise be to you, O Christ.

Then Jesus told them a parable about their need to pray always and not to lose heart. He said, "In a certain city there was a judge who neither feared God nor had respect for people. In that city there was a widow who kept

coming to him and saying, 'Grant me justice against my opponent. For a while he refused; but later he said to himself, 'Though I have no fear of God and no respect for anyone, yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will grant her justice, so that she may not wear me out by continually coming.'" And the Lord said, "Listen to what the unjust judge says. And will not God grant justice to his chosen ones who cry to him day and night? Will he delay long in helping them? I tell you, he will quickly grant justice to them. And yet, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?"

This is where the reading ends. It is the gospel of the Lord.

WORSHIP SUPPORT TEAM will meet in the library tomorrow at 6:00 pm.

ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING will take place on Sunday, November 10th. There will be only one service that morning at 9 am. The meeting to follow the service.

ANNUAL MEETING CHOIR: Since there is only one service on November 10th, there is an opportunity for folks who normally attend the early service to sing in the choir. It's also an opportunity for late service people to participate in a special musical event. If you are interested / willing, please contact Emily.

CONSTITUTION & BY-LAWS: At the Annual Meeting on November 10, 2019, we will vote on some amendments to our Constitution and By-Laws. Major changes include removing the list and descriptions of committees and task groups including term limits that we find impossible to follow. Committees will now be controlled by Council so adjustments can be made as needed (See Section 4.1 of the By-laws). We adjusted the terms for Elders to coordinate with having 4 Elders rather than 6, a change we made three years ago (See Section 4.2) We also added the word *active* <u>before</u> *member* in several locations to emphasize that quorums will be determined based on <u>active</u> membership. We replaced general mailing with communication to reflect our current use of electronic as well as paper communications (See Constitution Section 7.2, By-laws Section 5.3 and 5.4). Copies of the current [white paper] and proposed [pink] By-Laws are available on the information table.

ALL SAINT'S SUNDAY is November 3rd. As before, we will read the names of members of the congregation who have died in the past years. In addition, we will gather the names of persons who achieved their *sainthood* in previous years. You are invited to submit names of family members and friends. You are also encouraged to talk with your neighbors and invite them to submit names.
