to review what had been happening for the past few years before answering.

In 2011 [the most recent UCC Yearbook in the office], the following statistics are recorded:

Membership-513 Church School –120

Attendance-188

New members-10

Deaths-8

Members removed-160

I can't tell you what the current recorded membership size is for worship or church school.

What I know is that the average October attendance at the early service was 20 and the late, 50. That would be 70 total. Seventy is 37.2% of 188. Said differently, attendance now is two-thirds less than 8 years ago.

The question we need to ask ourselves is "Can these bones live?" Truly, God knows the answer, and I believe God will blow life into us. Keep in

mind: Zeke had to do the work; God did not do it for him.

My hope is that no one interprets this in terms of the congregation being lazy or doing nothing. Many, if not most, in this congregation are extremely diligent in the work they do continually for Myerstown UCC. We need to plan

how share <u>our</u> good news as we spread <u>the</u> Good News. It's a togetherness thing, I think.


Just because I wear two hats, doesn't mean they are both on all the time. Think in terms of two different people each wearing his own hat.

Greetings in the precious name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Agnes and I count it a great privilege to have you as our friends and partners in the ministry. I trust all is well with you as it is with us. As many of you know, our friend jack Reed and his wife(when she was alive,) have played a major role in our lives and ministry over the years. Each time I visited the US the Reeds were my hosts. Also, when friends send gifts to help us Jack has made sure that these gifts are sent to us in order to help supplement what comes through Campus crusade for Christ. As I have mentioned in the past, our support level is still a little over 70%. Out of this amount, Campus Crusade takes 12%, and when the money reaches here, 30% goes towards the government tax, leaving with very little to live on!

Let me now share with you a critical prayer need. As I plan to visit friends in the US next year Lord willing I need a host person/family and church, especially during my stay in Pennsylvania. Our friend Jack has been facing health and other challenges. Besides, his age is quite advanced and he cannot continue doing what he has been doing for us any longer. He is, however, willing to help sending gifts to us which come through him (and also his church for those who need tax deduction receipts). I know all what I wanted to communicate with you may not be clear through this e-mail!. My request is that you pray for this need, and if the Lord leads you to help me or us in this matter, I suggest that you write to me for any further clarification.
