Isaiah 35:1-10

“The desert and the dry land will be glad; the wilderness will rejoice and blossom like the crocus. They will burst into bloom, and rejoice with joy and singing. They will receive the glory of Lebanon, the splendor of Carmel and Sharon. They will see the Lord’s glory, the splendor of our God. Strengthen the weak hands, and support the unsteady knees. Say to those who are panicking: “Be strong! Don’t fear! Here’s your God, coming with vengeance; with divine retribution God will come to save you.”

Then the eyes of [those who cannot see] will be opened, and the ears of [those who cannot hear] will be cleared. Then [those who cannot move] will leap like the deer, and the tongue of [those who cannot make a sound] will sing. Waters will spring up in the desert, and streams in the wilderness. PINK SUNDAY: The candle we light today is the pink one. The third week of Advent is always a celebration of Mary, the mother of the Christ Child.

The rose was a privileged symbol for Mary, Queen of heaven and earth. One of her titles in Catholic devotion is Rosa Mystica. Thus, the Blessed Virgin is often referred to as the 'rose without thorns', since she was immaculately conceived. [https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Miracle_of_the_roses] The mystic rose, symbolizes Mary's mystical relationship as Heaven's Rose. This rose was developed in her honor.
