Pastor's Thoughts ...

I want to begin this, my final Pastor's column, by expressing my thanks to the members of Myerstown UCC. Serving as Interim Pastor has been a blessing and an opportunity for which I am grateful to have had. I will be leaving this position with many fond memories and experiences. I also want to share two expanded thoughts regarding congregational life and practice.

The first thought has regards how we communicate. The second has focuses upon proper boundaries within a congregation. In many ways, both serve to reinforce each other and serve as the basis of congregational health and vitality. When practiced genuinely, the occurrence of conflict is greatly lessened.

In the past year efforts have been undertaken to create a more transparent and open administration of the church. Though there are some issues which must be held close to the vest until decisions are made, much progress has been made in more fully involving and informing the congregation on matters affecting congregational life. It is encouraged to continue developing open and gracious lines for sharing information, concerns and for solving problems.

Effective communication within a congregation is addressed as being gracious and bringing blessing and reconciliation to all circumstances. In both the book of Proverbs and in Matthew, such traits are underscored. Nowhere is harsh, acrimonious or derogatory speech ever justified. In fact, St Paul states it this way, "When angry do not give in to the temptation to sin." (Ephesians 4: 26) And, thebook of James underscores that in any and all speech, "Be slow to speak and quick to listen." Yes, listening for understanding is critical to communication.

Members of congregations will have many occasions to be in discussion. Some topics will be easy and some far more difficult. But, in all cases the scriptures encourage direct, open and honest expressions. There should be every effort to speak for oneself and where speaking for another, then acknowledge for whom you are speaking. Never say things such as, "Well other people say..."; or other cloudy phrasing.

And, be willing and eager to listen for other's point of view or explanation. Never assume you know what was intended and please, never ascribe motives for which there is no direct evidence. And, of course, gossip, slander or bullying speech is always to be avoided. And, avoid passing along information unless the concerned person has given permission for you to share information. We gather as a congregation in order to support one another in fellowship, not to be nosey.

Be quick to congratulate, say thank you, and I am sorry. If all of this sounds like something taught in kindergarten, you are correct. But it never ceases to amaze me how many times members of congregations lose sight of these principles of communication. Boundaries can best be summed up by the Golden Rule. "Do unto others, as you would have done to you." A healthy respect for boundaries: respecting privacy, honoring confidences, having clear expectations, being open to collaborate on issues and never assuming knowledge without clear confirmation are but a few boundaries

Keep in mind, a pastor is not a news source. The pastor is not here to answer questions of curiosity. Concern about another member's wellbeing is best handled by speaking directly to the person or one responsible for them.

Also important is appreciate that the pastor has many concerns before them at any given moment. Prioritizing is often required and so some matters may well be delayed. But that does not indicate the pastor does not regard the tabled matter as unimportant.

And, every member of the church will err. Whether it is a typo, a misdirected piece of information, an honest forgetting to do a certain thing; these are all behaviors common to all members. Again, "So unto other...." is critical to respect for boundaries. Staff and members alike will make mistakes. And, most people if approached graciously and given half a chance will endeavor to correct mistakes.

I share these thoughts after working with this congregation for the past year. The self-study makes clear that communication and respect for boundaries have not always been a hallmark of the congregation's life together. By the grace of God, second chances are at hand. My prayer is that every member of Myerstown UCC will endeavor to daily strive to improve communication and respect boundaries.

As for me, I want to address a boundary issue to which I have pledged my commitment to follow. The Pastor's code of ethics is very specific. It is also a matter to which any and every ordained and authorized clergy serving in the United Church of Christ have promised to follow. This code has existed since our denomination's inception.

As such, as I leave Myerstown, I will respect and honor the rights and privileges of whoever the incoming pastor is. This means, I will not, unless directly invited by the standing pastor, whether Interim, temporary or permanent, involve myself in the ongoing life of the congregation. I will not be providing pastoral services or discuss congregation matters with any member of the church.

Though initially there may be some matters to which I will be asked to attend, such will only be the case until a new interim or permanent pastor is called to serve Myerstown UCC. Let there be no misunder-standing. I value the many contacts I have made during my time, but I am now finished and as such it is my responsibility to take my leave.

Again, thank you for the opportunity to serve and share with you this past year.

#### **Highlights from the July Council Meeting:**

### Council Meeting Summary – July 2019 Tuesday, 6:30 pm, July 2, 2019

Minutes and treasurer reports were reviewed and approved. Thanksgivings and concerns about members were expressed. Staff reports followed. Pastor Luciotti shared an inquiry from Lebanon Association to share a pastor with Grace UCC in Lebanon. Council requested a letter from Grace clarifying what they are looking for. While open to all possibilities, the profile has just been posted and it was decided we should give it a little time before exploring other possibilities. There was a discussion about the need for clarification about announcements about the death of members' families and what the protocol should be. This also included discussion about the prayer list. Pastor Luciotti suggested that we create a prayer chain based on the prayer list, which should be managed by the church office and an appointed Elder. The Elders will be asked to create a protocol. Parish Administrator Emily Frantz shared that the visitation lists have been updated. She also shared the great job that Katie Fields has been doing as our Temporary Secretary including sending out letters, updating electronic files, and organizing the cemetery files into a digital record. Committee and Task Group reports followed including a request from personnel committee to offer a small scholarship to Katie Fields for her service during our time of need. This was approved by Council. Other items discussed were August performance reviews for employees and an update on the secretary position, along with a motion to approve Beverly Asroff as secretary, which was approved. Christian Education Committee shared that they met to finalize Summer Adventure. Property Committee did not meet but dealt with issues that resulted from kids pulling glass from the broken window in the Parish House. Worship Support Team has recommended two services beginning in September which was approved by Council. The first service will be the abbreviated Service of the Word held at 8:00 am. The second service will be traditional liturgical worship. The group is to further investigate whether 10:00 am or 10:30 am would be a better time based on the discussion at Council and get back to Council prior to the August meeting for a finalized vote. The bylaws revisions are coming along. In August Council will be asked to voted on the final inactive membership list which is being organized by the church office. There will be a financial advisory committee created to tackle the issues faced by not being able to find a church treasurer. Emily, Lindy, and Kathy Grose from personnel will create this group. Supply pastors are filled for the month of August and special music has been planned including Rodney Shearer and Katie Gehman. The motion to accept Mike Ebersole's resignation with regret was approved by Council. Meeting concluded with prayer and was adjourned.
