Pastor's Thoughts...

Interestingly, the road to Jerusalem begins with acts of contrition. Is it possible, that if Peter had humbled himself instead of attempting to change Jesus' direction, that Peter would have avoided his three-fold denial of Christ? Though the question is purely speculative, it invites us to consider how we may grow in our faith and be empowered to be more loyal to Christ.

Ash Wednesday is to be the most uncomfortable day of the church year. At this juncture, we most clearly are able to see exactly who we are. In the light of the Transfiguration, our awareness of our sin is never more apparent. We know that the coming weeks will culminate in the celebration of Easter and God's declaration of our salvation. But can we fully appreciate and receive the good news if we first and foremost fail to take seriously our brokenness? Will we be able to utilize, as empowerment, the comfort of our salvation if we do not enter into the discipline of the coming season?

This is a dramatic moment in our faith walk. We stand at a crossroad of determining whether we will be full participants in the Body of Christ or mere spectators. Who we truly are, as opposed to who we want to imagine ourselves to be, is the focus of this event. We are offered the opportunity to wrestle with the finite nature of our condition, in body, mind and spirit. The illusion of being god in our own life is never more fully exposed. All of the skills and cleverness with which we attempt to manage our daily lives are revealed as inadequate. There is only one appropriate response, repent and turn completely one more to God.

Jesus offers a pattern for this day and for our lives. With sincerity, simplicity and privately, the Lord teaches, "Present your gift, pray and place complete reliance on the things of heaven, not upon earthly treasures."

Heavenly God, may the words of the prophet Joel be upon our lips and in our hearts this day. "Return to the Lord, your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love. (Joel 2:13)

HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE FEBRUARY COUNCIL MEETING:

The meeting began with a devotion, followed by Thanksgivings, Concerns, and Who's Missing from our Congregation. Pastor's report was presented along with a report and thoughts from the Interim Pastoral Assistant. Minutes from prior meeting were approved. The congregational meeting minutes must be approved by the congregation at the next congregational meeting. The Treasurer's report was unavailable for this meeting and will be approved at the next meeting. Reports were received from Christian Education, Personnel, and Property. Highlights include: dates set for Christian Education events, Steven Fritsch will serve as Chair of the Personnel Committee who will begin reviewing all job descriptions, and an update on the front door proposal. Property is also investigating the cause of almost daily alerts being sent to Yarnell, our security system

Task groups and Ministry Teams shared reports: Community Meal, Worship Support Team, Elders/Care Team, and the Congregational Assessment Team. Highlights include the WST proposal to change worship times which was approved by Council. This information is included in full elsewhere in the Vineyard. The CAT Team will present a summary meeting to the congregation on March 17th. This is also described in detail elsewhere in the Vineyard. Kristi Fields has almost completed typing the by-laws of our congregation in order to have them reviewed by a By-laws revision group. The Council decided not to hold an Ash Wednesday service at MUCC this year as it falls during Pastor Rick's vacation and has had low attendance in previous years. Further discussion ensued on the schedule for Holy Week services. This item was tabled until the March meeting.


Our meals served again on:

We will be serving baked chicken, mashed pota toes/gravy, green beans, roll/butter and whoopie pies for dessert.



On Tuesday, February 5th, Church Council approved the recommendation of the Worship Support Team to change our worship schedule on a trial basis. Beginning the first Sunday of Lent, March 10th through May 19th, there will be two different styles of worship provided following this schedule:

8:00 am

Service of the Word – opening hymn, liturgy and prayers, scripture, and message, closing verse

Service will be approximately 25 minutes

Ministry volunteer will serve as a greeter

Pew Communion will be the first Sunday of the month. A ministry volunteer will assist the Pastor with preparation and serving communion.

8:45 am

Small group ministry – including Sunday School classes, and any other ministries that may wish to meet during this time

10:00 am

Traditional worship – including children's sermon, offering, choir anthems and additional music ministry
Service will be approximately 50 – 60 minutes

Ministry volunteers will serve as greeters, ushers, worship leaders, sound technicians, communion preparation (once a month), and gathering time providers and servers.

Communion by Intinction will be the first Sunday of the month. Worship leader and ushers will assist the Pastor with serving communion

Sunday, May 26th through September 1st, we will follow a Summer Schedule with one blended worship service at 9:00 am. Communion will be the first Sunday of each month: pew communion June and August and Intinction in July.

The worship support team will meet again in May to dis cuss benefits and challenges of this schedule. They will look at attendance, staffing needs, feedback from congregants,

etc. and will provide a report to Council for their June meeting. A decision will be made during the summer about worship and small group opportunities for Fall 2019.
