Pastor's Thoughts...

The Congregational Assessment Report is now in hand and being reviewed by the committee formed to undertake this vital task. To everyone who chose to take part in the process, I want to express my thanks and appreciation. I am certain it was a time consuming and thought provoking process. I am also grateful for the information this is providing to me as I continue in the work of serving as Interim Pastor. I want to suggest that as we prepare to discuss the conclusions of the report and more importantly, how to implement the recommendations, that we keep the following scripture firmly in mind. Psalm 133 reads as follow, "How good it is when God's people live together in unity." And, the prophet Isaiah's thoughts begin, "Come, let us reason together." The thoughts are encouragement inspired by our creator to gather in a spirit of cooperation and seeking consensus in all matters before us. It is an invitation to thorough and lively discuss, debate and resolution for building up the fellowship, as well deciding on how to establish priorities and to resolve any and all disagreements. The underlying principle is that we are stronger together, than we could ever be alone.

This is also an admonition to awareness of the reality that no one among has all of the answers and that in most circumstances our thoughts and ideas may well be incomplete, or even incorrect. In this way a community striving for unity and taking the time to reason together have the ability to avoid many unfortunate and often regrettable actions.

The key is a community in unity and of course participation or service. Unity is not simply the going along with the crowd in order to avoid controversy; and reasoning is not listening only until an opportunity presents itself to inform others of just how wrong we believe they are regarding some issue or another.

First and foremost is maturing to understand that all matters are best considered by serious attention and study, prayer for insight and wisdom, and a willingness to listen carefully for God's still small voice and to one another. If we allow God's Holy Spirit to lead us, the process will result in consensus. And, consensus is the key for congregational unity. It does not mean that everyone will view the outcome with complete celebration, but it does assure that in all future discussions others will become increasingly willing to give careful ear to what others think, feel and have to say. Practicing the seeking of consensus insures that we come to view all members as equals and as disciples working together for the ministry of the Gospel.

I hope in the coming months to encourage greater willingness to participate fully in the life and service of Myerstown United Church of Christ. In this way we can begin to model for the larger community a more peaceful and thoughtful manner for living in community. The practice of the early church, as outlined in the book of Acts is the model. May we be in prayerful study, meditation and practice of how the early church strove for unity.

Proposed By-Law Amendment

Below is a copy of an amendment to the Myerstown United Church of Christ Constitution and By-Laws. This amendment would transfer the duties of the Cemetery Committee to the Church Property Committee. The amendment was approved by the Council at the September meeting. The amendment will be presented to and voted on by the congregation at the annual meeting in November. Church members will be receiving additional notice of this amendment prior to the annual meeting.

Proposed amendment to Myerstown United Church of Christ Constitution and By-Laws:

Duties of the Cemetery Board transferred to the Church Property Committee:

- 1) Delete Article VIII Sections 8.1, 8.2, 8.3 and 8.4 regarding Cemetery Board
- 2) Amend Article IV Section 4.2c to read as follows

Church Property: This committee oversees the maintenance, repair, preventive maintenance and safety of all church properties. The Church Property Committee is responsible for all minor and major repairs and construction projects for church facilities.

The Church Property Committee will act as the Cemetery Board and oversee the Mt. Hope Cemetery and Old Union Cemetery. Responsibilities of the committee acting as the Cemetery Board include but are not limited to:

- a. Developing an annual budget.
- b. Maintaining an accurate listing of burial plots
- c. Executing and delivering deeds for plots;
- d. Establishing burial fees and fees for the sale of plots
- e. Arranging for the care and maintenance of cemetery property
- f. Approving the payment of all bills for cemetery expenses and forwarding approved bills to the Church Treasurer for payment.

Monies for the Church Improvement Fund, Mt. Hope Cemetery and Old Union Cemetery will be held in separate accounts. Cemetery Funds are only to be used for care and maintenance of Mt. Hope Cemetery and Old Union Cemetery. Funding for any repairs/improvements regarding the cemeteries will be at the discretion of the Church Property Committee to discern if a property or cemetery expense.



October is Pastor Appreciation month October 14 is Pastor Appreciation Day.

Celebrated annually on the second Sunday in October falls a nonofficial holiday called Pastor Appreciation Day. Sometimes called Clergy Appreciation Day, this holiday occurs during Pastor Appreciation Month and celebrates the contributions of priests, pastors, reverends and ministers in the U.S.

Pastor Appreciation Day began with the establishment of Clergy Appreciation Month. In Timothy 1 (5:17), Paul began the concept of clergy appreciation when he stated that the elders of the church are worthy of a double honor. He reiterated this idea in Thessalonians 1 (5: 12-13) when he stated that that those who work hard among you should be held in the highest regard for their work. This idea became Clergy Appreciation Month in 1992, established by pastors and religious workers. Eventually, Pastor Appreciation Day would form out of this month.
