Pastor's Thoughts...

As I begin serving Myerstown United Church of Christ in the role of Interim Pastor, I want to share a few thoughts concerning myself and also upon our work together in preparing the congregation for a permanent pastor. I do look forward to our working closely on the process of determining goals and methods for Myerstown UCC and especially for strengthening the practice of congregational polity.

A section of scripture that I consider vital for a healthy church is from James, chapter one, verses seventeen through twenty seven. Here we read, "Everyone should grow to become quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to anger; for human anger does not produce the righteousness God desires." In this thought we are given much to ponder for our spiritual growth.

First, be quick to listen. By this is understood being patient and not only allowing one to finish what they want to say, but also to spend time ponder and praying about what has been heard. Secondly, in being slow to speak, we are encouraged to consider carefully any and all words we might want to share with others. We must always take the time to evaluate whether our thoughts are fact or opinion, helpful or not, positive or destructive. And, third, slow to anger. Here we must pause to take into account what is meant by this translation. By anger is understood the characteristic of expressing concerns or grievances in a wrathful or vengeful manner. It does not mean you should never feel anger. Truly, there are many things in life that will be wrong and need to be addressed. But, as the Apostle Paul wrote, "When feeling angry, do not sin." The writer of James and Paul are expressing the same thought. A true mark of righteousness is learning to express our concern in a manner that offer peaceful and life affirming correction to difficulties and concerns.

I share this thought, not that I am by any means an expert in behaving in such a manner; but, as a goal to guide our work together. As I grow older, I am ever more aware of the importance of this thought to listen deeply and carefully, not just being patient until someone else finishes speaking. I also am reminded that thinking long and hard before speaking and acting is a great gift to bring to any relationship.

I hope we can all keep this passage from James clearly in mind as we go forward.

I cannot tell you how long a process it will be in selecting a new pastor. There are too many variables. But, what I intend to do is offer as much information regarding the work church Council and I are doing, and to encourage many opportunities for all members to hear and to be heard. The role of Interim pastor is to assist and to serve a congregation in preparing itself for the task of calling a new pastor. I hope you will all be an active part in this process.



Dear Prayer Partners,

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ from Nairobi. I trust this brief e-mail finds you well. Agnes and I are fine in the Lord. We praise God for the privilege of being his children and servants. We praise him too for your partnership with us in the ministry of advancing God's kingdom in Africa and the world. Thank you particularly for your fervent prayers on our behalf. When I was in the US, I shared with many of you a number of needs for you to pay about. One of those needs is that of replacing our aging car, which requires approximately \$12,000! Let me share with you an experience I had this morning Kenyan time, on my way to work. The car developed problems such that I had to abruptly stop in the middle of the road! I tried to start the car but it could not work out. I called our mechanic to come so that we get the car towed to the garage. The only option I had was to walk quite a distance, carrying my laptop bag as well as other items I was taking to the office! Please pray that God will come to our help in this regard. Pray also for me as I prepare to start teaching our beloved students on Monday August 27th, 2018. Finally, pray for Agnes as she ministers to over 100 women on Friday August 24th. May God bless you.

Fall begins on Saturday, September 22

The **autumnal equinox**—also called the **September or fall equinox**—is the astronomical start of fall in the Northern Hemisphere and spring in the Southern Hemisphere.

The word *equinox* comes from the Latin *aequus* (equal) and *nox* (night).

During the equinox, the Sun crosses what we call the "celestial equator" (just imagine the line that marks the equator on Earth extending up into the sky) from north to south. Because of this, Earth's two hemi spheres receive the Sun's rays about equally. The Sun is overhead at noon as seen from the equator, so at this point, the amount of nighttime and daytime (sunlight) are roughly equal to each other.
