Search Committee Report:

We are excited to announce that at the Sunday, December 15 meeting, Council voted and passed unanimously to move forward in the process to hire a part-time pastor. **Rev. Paul R. Cronin** was approved in the role as a **Designated Pastor** for a three-year term and, hopefully, after three years we would be able to make it a full-time position.

Paul resides with his wife and family in Bernville, PA. Paul was ordained October 13, 1985 and his current standing is held in the Pennsylvania Southeast Conference by the PS Covenant Association. Pastor Paul is a 1976 graduate of LaRoche College with a degree in Religion/Psychology and a 1985 graduate from Lancaster Theological Seminary with a Masters of Divinity. Paul has served in five different congregations since 1983. He spent three years at United Church of Roscoe in New York, twelve years at First Congregational in Walton, NY, and twelve years at Faith Unity/New Creation UCC in Easton, PA. Paul has a lot of knowledge and experience and a few of his strengths are church growth and size transition, preaching, children sermons and connecting with the community.

The Trial Sermon will be held on **Sunday, January 5** with one service beginning at **9:00 A.M.** Following the service, Rev. John Fureman will be leading the congregation in a vote. All active member who are present that day are invited to vote. Additionally, a "Meet and Greet" will be held on **Saturday, January 4** in the Social Hall beginning at **6:00 P.M.** Paul will be introduced and then he will share his background, experience and excitement of becoming the new part-time pastor of Myerstown United Church of Christ. We will have an opportunity for a question and answer session and will conclude the evening with light refreshments.

If you have any questions, please direct them to the Search Committee or any member of Church Council.

If Pastor Paul is voted and approved by the congregation on Sunday, January 5th, this will start the 45-day notice for Jim Yoder our current Bridge Pastor. His last day in the capacity of Bridge Pastor will be Wednesday, February 19. The starting date for Paul is set for Monday, February 3, and this will allow 2 weeks overlap with Jim and Paul for a smooth transition.

The financial package is based on Conference Guidelines and all amounts are based on 50% of a full-time pastor.

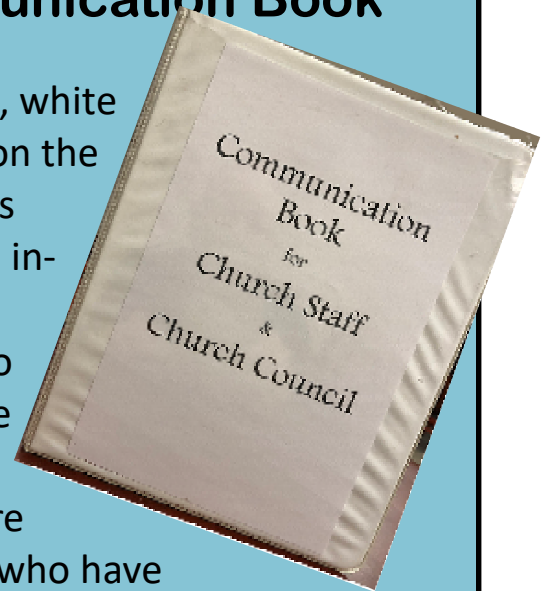
