Sunday March 1st is the first Sunday of Lent. And as you may have heard at the Ash Wednesday Service, the theme for Lent is REPENT. Now that may seem like a pretty heavy theme to start out, it may even seem rather dreadful. But what I mean by Repent is its more literal translation. Literally, Repent means to STOP moving in the direction one is moving in, to TURN AROUND, and to MOVING IN DIRECTION. In terms of Scriptural context, to repent is to stop doing that thing which is destructive to our relationship with God, or destructive to ourselves or others, to turn from that behavior and to follow a path that is guided by the God who loves us.

This pattern is repeated throughout our scriptural heritage. From the very beginning with the second creation story, to King David and his behavior surrounding another man's wife, to the people of Israel being called to repent of...just about everything. What they were being called by God to turn away from was darkness and despair and called to turn and approach the gentle light of peace, joy and hope.

We will be exploring several of this examples turning repentance from narratives from the Hebrew scriptures, the epistles and from the gospels. I have provided the main text from each sermon for the month of March along with a brief description of the theme. I invite you to read over those scriptures and discover what they mean to you before we share them together in Worship. I believe that you have called me to work with you to allow God to help us to turn around from decline, and even some despair and move in a new direction, guided by God, to light, joy and a renewed vision of positively impacting the lives of members of this community and the surrounding areas. I pray that this Lenten Journey will be a good beginning, and we will Journey with God.

The naming of each Sunday has some reminders of what is coming up. We hope you will note the time change on the 8th, One Great Hour of Sharing all church offering on the 22nd and of course St. Patrick's Sunday, on the 15th, when it would be a wonderful thing if you would join me in wearing green...just for fun.

I'm looking forward to a meaningful Lenten season together as we move toward the events in Jerusalem, culminating in an empty cross and the Joy of Resurrection!




2020 LENTEN BREAKFAST

One of the thoughts I encountered early in this ministry was a statement made by Rev Dr Carrie Call, our Conference President. At the Lebanon Association Fall Meeting. She said, "The church is like a mosaic." As she went on to interpret these words, my mind went with her and then sped ahead.

To me, a mosaic is many different shapes, sizes, colors, and media that come together and make a recognizable picture or exquisite design. The artist is able fashion and refashion all the elements that works well together.

Every person who is part of the Myerstown UCC community has been entrusted with gifts. Our skill sets are very different. You certainly don't want me to try and fix a broken screen.
