Did You Know

Early Christians had to be careful to whom they acknowledged being a Christian. The fish would not be an obvious Christian symbol to persecutors; it is said that during the persecution of the early church, a Christian meeting someone new would draw a single arc in the sand. If the other person was a Christian, he or she would complete the drawing of a fish with a second arc. The

combined arcs formed the shape of a fish. If the second person was not a Christ, the ambiguity of the halfsymbol would not reveal the first

person as a Christian.
